

Audience Balance (Heart):


Iowa 4-H Programs in each county need to reach out and be available to ALL youth. At this time, we can only evaluate how closely the numbers of youth we reach reflect the county youth population by race/ethnicity and by gender.

An Extension program is in parity when the participation of individuals of minority groups reflects the proportionate representation in the population of potential recipients.

A program will be considered in compliance when its participation has reached 80% of parity.







Statewide Average Participants




