
What is it?



- Centralized Database:
 - Information on programs offered and attendance
 - Contacts (participants, media, etc)
 - Partnerships
 - Client Relationships
 - Program Outputs/Impact Measurements

What is it?





All direct educational contacts (touchpoints) and associated programs for a single county in a single month

- Streamlines data collection making reporting easier.
- More accurate measurement of educational outcomes and impact.
- Real-time Data

What's the value?






Example data dashboard showing events and educational contacts during current and previous time periods from the perspective of a regional director

Program Planning Decisions



- Program Catalog What's possible?
- Which programs have been offered?
 - Number, what and which program area
- Were programs well-attended?
- What's working/what isn't?

Program Planning Decisions




- Are there neighboring counties doing similar programs?
- May include Impact/Evaluation data
- Does not replace good communications within the organization

Entries



- Normally the organizer enters information
 - Each educator speaking is credited
- May include client information, including county of residence
- Communication is key on who enters what






- Privacy is paramount policies to protect

- Not every meeting will include client information (beyond numbers)

Connections are records about the individual's participation


Outcomes



- For some specific programs, combining outcomes data from across the state
 - Changes in behavior or knowledge
 - X% adopted a practice
 - Understanding of X increased from 2/5 to 4/5
 - Value
 - \$/cow, \$/acre, etc

Outcomes





Examples of Outcomes and Outputs reported by 4-H and CED in during the pilot phase of outcome (and output) measurement.

Example Impacts (ANR)



- Soil Fertility Short Course
 - Increased profit \$126,500 on 11,500 acres
- Advanced Calving Clinics
 - 9 clinics with 350+ attendees
 - Average benefit of \$7.56 per cow
 - Total benefit of \$375,900

Example Impacts (ANR)



- Ag marketing clubs
 - Improved crop marketing knowledge resulted in improvement of \$21/acre or \$1.7 million total
- Forest management
 - 238 people applied what they learned to 11,444 acres
