


## Beginnings of the organization

- January 1998 first articles of incorporation were written for Iowa Association of County Extension Councils (IACEC); guided by Mark Settle
  - Connect the council members across the state
  - Correct a perceived geographic disparity
  - Advocate with the legislature
- 2013 Terry Maloy was named the first executive director
- 2013 Background Screening benefit added
- 2014 Employee Assistance Program (EAP) benefit added
- 2015 Offered legal services (Whitfield & Eddy) benefit
- 2016 changed name to Iowa Extension Council Association (IECA)
- 2020 Terry Maloy retired and Jennifer Vit hired

#### Board Members

- Connect with other councils in their region
- Serve as conduit to extension administration

#### Board Meetings

Meets at least 3 times per year (more as needed) in October, January, and June

#### Executive Board

- Meets monthly via zoom
- Approves expenditures up to \$2000
- Keeps association business moving forward

- Human Resources & Member Services
- Finance, Policy, & Legislation
