
What is K-12 Outreach?

4-H learning opportunities that occur in a K-12 educational setting.

K-12 Outreach is an opportunity to partner with schools or before/after school partners to support classroom learning and educational standards with hands-on learning experiences.

Experiential Learning Model

- 1. Participant(s) **experience** the activity—perform or do it.
- 2. Participant(s) **share** the experience by describing what happened.
- 3. Participant(s) **process** the experience to determine what was most important and identify common themes.
- 4. Participant(s) **generalize** from the experience and relate it to their daily lives.
- 5. Participant(s) **apply** what they learned to a new situation.



Characteristics of K-12 Outreach

- Typically occurs in a school during, immediately before, or immediately after school hours.
- May be facilitated by a K-12 Outreach professional or another county youth professional.
- 4-H experiences are defined as six or more educational contact hours.
- Provides 4-H experiences to young people who may not participate in 4-H club programming.
 - An opportunity to promote 4-H club membership opportunities.

Why do some counties have K-12 Outreach educators?

- County Youth Coordinators (or other title variations) have a lot on their plate – not enough time in schedule.
- County extension council values opportunity to partners with local school district(s) & extend 4-H program to more youth.
 - Offers huge potential for program growth/reach.
 - Opportunity to reach underserved/unserved youth.
- Help support summer day camp opportunities in addition to school outreach.

Challenges with K-12 Outreach

- Council members or other staff members understanding K-12 role
- Finding candidates for the positions unique skill set, helpful if they have a background in education
- Can be challenging to get into some schools or districts
- Finding funds to support a second youth position, curriculum, and resources

Promoting Additional Opportunities

- Before or after school clubs
- Promoting club opportunities during outreach
- Promoting summer day camps or residential camps during outreach
- Robotics program/competition group

What K-12 Outreach professionals want you to know

- "Role role can be just as valuable as a CYC, and we help more kids have a 4-H experience."
- "Counties can pool resources to support more opportunities."
- "These 4-H experiences are great for kids who might otherwise be unable to participate in 4-H because of family situations or other reasons."
